JOINT STATEMENT ON THE INCIDENT AT AL AQSA ISLAMIC SOCIETY

Al Aqsa Islamic Society and School are founding and active partners in both the Interfaith Center of Greater Philadelphia and the Religious Leaders Council of Greater Philadelphia. Today we stand with Imam Mohamed Shehata and our friends in that community, saddened that they have been victims of a vile act of desecration targeting a sacred place of worship and study. We have known the great beauty, peace, love, and strength that comes from our work together as diverse faith communities. Together we weave bonds that cannot be broken; together we demonstrate that religion can be a force for good; and *together* we continue to publicly affirm our commitment to *Dare to Understand* one another.
